



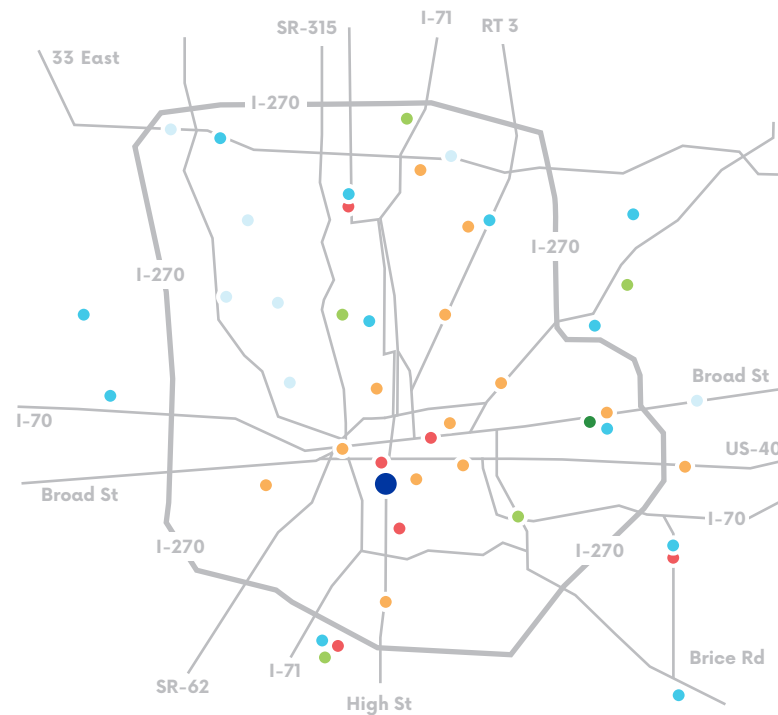
Meet Humberto
